



January 29, 2014 - South Sound Chamber of Commerce Legislative Coalition Detail Bill Report compiled by our lobbyist Carolyn Logue of CA Logue Public Affairs.

The South Sound Chamber of Commerce Legislative Coalition (SSCCLC) was formed to advocate for business and business-related policies impacting the South Sound region before the Legislature, Statewide elected officials such as the Governor, and other departments, agencies, boards and commissions. Member Chambers include: Auburn Area (Auburn, Algona and Pacific), Covington, Federal Way, Fife/Milton/Edgewood, Kent, Puyallup-Sumner, Renton and Southwest King County (Tukwila, Burien & Des Moines) Chambers of Commerce. Collectively, we represent approximately 3,262 businesses employing more than 185,977 workers in the South King County and North Pierce County region.

The primary goals of our Coalition are increasing jobs, competitiveness, and regional productivity. The South King and Pierce County region is an economic powerhouse for the state with significant manufacturing, retail, service and warehousing industries. In addition, it sits between the state's two largest seaports and highways in the region serve as major corridors for both north-south and east-west travel. Creates an expedited environmental review and approval process for transportation projects that require preparation of an environmental impact statement and requires the department of transportation to use the process. Requires certain state and local agencies to provide technical assistance to the department of transportation on accomplishing the project review and coordination activities. Requires the department of transportation to: (1) Streamline the permitting process by developing and maintaining positive relationships with regulatory agencies and Indian tribes; and (2) Continue its efforts to improve training and compliance. Requires the department of ecology to: (1) Update certain rules for integrating use of national environmental policy act documents in decisions under the state environmental policy act; (2) Update rule-based categorical exemptions for transportation maintenance activities; and (3) Convene a work group to identify procedures to more effectively achieve certain objectives with regard to harmonizing local land use reviews with maintenance and improvement of state transportation facilities.
