South Sound Chamber of Commerce 2015 Legislative Report & Upcoming Events

Week One Update 1/12 - 1/16/15

The 2015 Legislative got started with the usual pomp and circumstance. Swearing in of legislators, work sessions in committee, bill introductions, etc... Most went as planned or expected – except for a vote in the Senate where Republicans hold a slim margin for the majority but were planning to re-seat Senator Tim Sheldon (D) as the President Pro-Tem. This is a position Senator Sheldon held during the two years of the "Majority Coalition Caucus" when Democrats had an actual majority but Sheldon and fellow D Rodney Tom both voted with Republicans to put the Republicans in control of leadership positions. Instead, on Monday, the Senate Democrats voted with Senator Pam Roach (R) and Senator Don Benton (R) to put Senator Roach in the position of President Pro-Tem, unseating Sheldon. The Senate also voted in a rule for their house that requires a 2/3rds vote for new taxes. This 2/3rds vote does not apply to existing taxes and fees and also only binds the Senate – not the Governor or the House.

Hearings were held this week on the Governor's budget proposals but we don't expect real discussions on the budget to get going until early February into March. Most policy bills will start to have hearings in the next week and the first committee cut off isn't for four more weeks.

As you can see by the list below, we are staring to see quite a few bills introduced. I have highlighted the ones that are most important for the SSCCLC to review or get members involved with.

Transportation: Key here is that, while there has been a transportation budget introduced, reform bills introduced and we expect to see a carbon tax soon, nothing concrete has been established. However, we do know that internal discussions are happening and we hope to see a transportation package from Senator King in the next week. In the meantime, please keep urging our local legislators to fully fund and complete the South Sound projects.

Education: So far we are seeing policy bills but the real impact on education is going to come from the overall budget discussions. Republicans in both the House and Senate have introduced bills to fund Education first in separate budget from the operating budget. In addition, Senator Hill has introduced a bill to dedicate 2/3rds of new revenues to education. More attention is being paid to career and technical education and also to expanding dual college and high school credit options for grades 10-12. Since the Governor's budget does not fund the provisions of I-1351, the WEA testified against this portion of his budget during hearings this week.

Business: As expected, Democrats in the House and Senate have introduced bills to increase the minimum wage to \$12/hour, fund the paid family & medical leave act, mandate paid sick leave, and mandate paid vacation. The Senate has also introduced SB 5332 which will pre-empt local ordinances on wage and hour. The minimum wage increase bill and paid sick leave are expected to have hearings in the House during the third week of session. The minimum wage increase will be heard on the 26th of January
